Update: Akuapem Hills Preparatory School (AHPS), Akropong-Akuapem, Eastern Region, Ghana – October 2018

I bring you warm greetings from pupils, students, staff, parents and guardians of AHPS. The blessings of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ continue to abound in our school. Your prayers and financial support throughout the years have not been in vain. Once again we would like to express our profound gratitude to Chudleigh Parish Church, the PCC and Rev. Paul Wimsett, Chudleigh News, The Phoenix and others for publicizing our cause to the Chudleigh community and beyond.

In January 2018, we managed to rebuild the burnt down Multi-purpose hall at a cost of GHC 95,000.00 (about £19,000). This was very crucial as our pioneers (the Junior High Secondary School (JHS) finalists – 15 year olds) were able to start their mock examinations under proper exams rules in such a spacious hall. Before the actual Basic Education Certificate Examination (BECE), our students managed to complete six mock (practice) exams of nine subjects before the actual BECE in June. Two weeks before the exams, we boarded all the 13 students (6 girls and 7 boys) at the South Campus until they completed all their exams which were a week long. It is therefore without surprise that they all came out with flying colours, achieving 100% passes in all the nine subjects. They have all received their best choices of Senior High Secondary School placement. Their best performed subject was English Language where their lowest score was 3, (the exams highest scoring is 1 and lowest is 9), and following second was Science.

We had our Parent Teacher Association (PTA) meeting on Wednesday 26th September 2018 where we discussed our current and pressing need of a school bus. The school currently hires a private minibus at very high cost to both parents and the school. Parents agreed to contribute towards the purchase of a school bus by the end of September 2019. We are not in the position to purchase a brand new bus, we hope to go for a used mini-bus which may cost around GHC 350,000.00 (about £70,000.00).

He also thanked all individuals and Chudleigh Parish Church for their support throughout the years.
